We only can surrender to the Lord, knowing He is working in us the perfect work, a work that is not complete but has just started.


Hold your anxiety, dissolve it in the faith Christ has given you. Let your eyes look forward to His purpose, knowing day to day we walk and stumble.

Robert was born on July 11, 1964, in Montebello, Calif., and raised by his uncle, Harry Leeland Clark.

On June 20, 1987, Robert married Melinda Stover in Irvine, Calif., where he was stationed at Tustin Marine Corps Air Station. He relocated to Washington, D.C., serving at the Pentagon, and then moved to Breton Bay in 1997. Robert earned business administration degrees from the Florida Institute of Technology (FIT) and Regis University.

A 20-year veteran, he served in the U.S. Marine Corps and Air Force. In June 2021, he retired from the Department of the Navy after 19 years as a senior contracts specialist, procuring major weapon systems and engineering services for the Navy.

Robert's life's passion was serving the Lord, and he spent 36 years in the mission field. His favorite saying was: **“Let's all tend to the Father's business and not worry about what's going on in the world.”** He led various ministries, including outreach at Tustin MCAS and evangelistic activities on the USS New Orleans and USS Peleliu. He supported overseas pastors during his numerous deployments to the Philippines. During a one-year period, he led an evangelistic ministry that consisted of walking a 12-foot cross all over St. Mary's County and Washington D.C.

Robert founded The Mission in 2005. He served as its senior pastor, sharing the Gospel with the homeless and working poor. The Mission recently opened the first Christian-based care center dedicated to single men and women in St. Mary's County. He never forgot the poverty of his upbringing, and his heart went out to all those who have little. He was the first in the family to own his own home and have a college education.

Robert also loved telling stories and writing poems/prayers, which he published in the local newspapers.

Most of all, Robert was a very generous person and, out of the blue, was always blessing people with something they needed.

Robert is survived by his wife, Melinda; his twin brother, Richard Eugene Myers (Brenda Kay Moschell) of Leonardtown; his sister, Joan Marie Clark of Charlotte Hall, Md.; his brothers: Edward (Monte) Myers of Charlotte Hall; Fabrice Clark (Jeanna Cosbey) of Blue Springs, Mo.; and Lenny Clark of San Antonio, Texas; and nieces, nephews, and cousins
